# Bathroom Budget Worksheet

A simple worksheet to estimate your total bathroom remodel budget — before you talk to a single contractor.



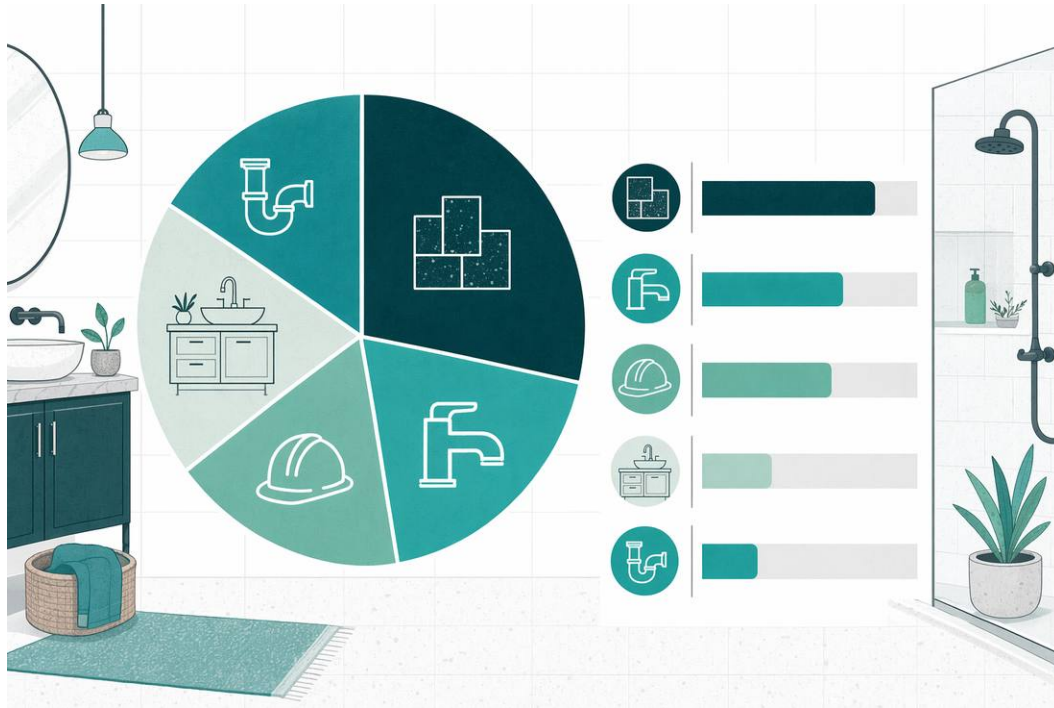
Plan your bathroom remodel with open eyes — then get matched, free, with licensed, insured remodelers near you. You compare quotes and choose who to hire.

## Start with the scope

The scope of work sets your starting price. These are typical US ranges — estimates, not quotes. Your real number depends on the size of the bathroom, the tile and fixtures, hidden moisture damage, and how much plumbing you move.

## Typical ranges by scope

Project scope	Typical range	What's included
Minor refresh	\$3,000–\$10,000	Paint, vanity, fixtures, re-caulk, hardware
Mid-range remodel	\$10,000–\$25,000	New tile, shower, vanity, fixtures, floor
Full gut renovation	\$25,000–\$50,000+	Move plumbing, new layout, all-new everything

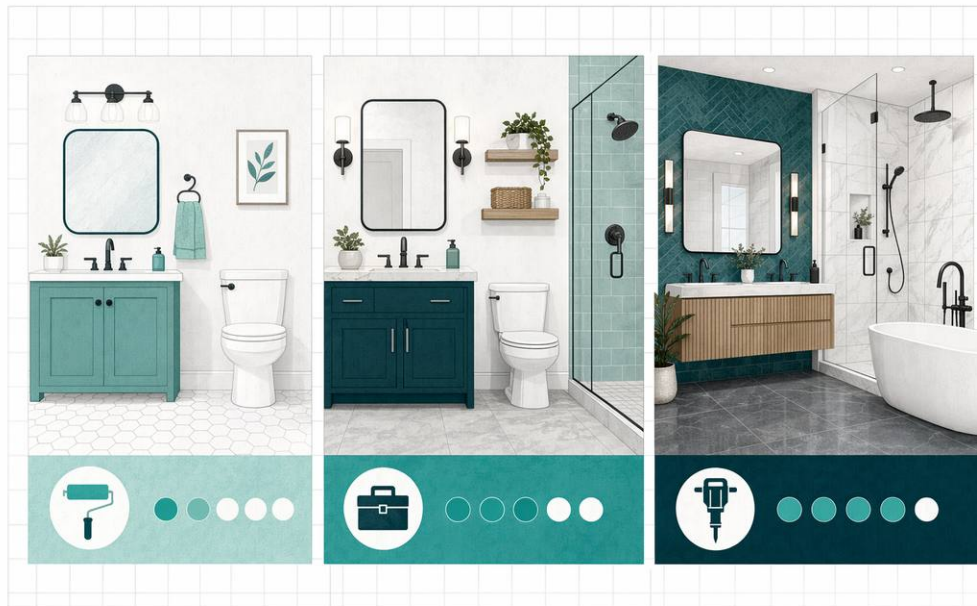


## Where the money usually goes

- Tile and tile labor (often a top line item in a bathroom)
- The shower or tub — and waterproofing behind it
- Plumbing and electrical work, and any moved fixtures
- Vanity, countertop, sink, mirror, and lighting
- Flooring, paint, and ventilation
- Permits and inspections

## Don't forget the hidden costs

- Moisture or rot found once the old tile comes off
- Re-routing plumbing if you change the layout
- Disposal and dumpster fees
- Upgrades to old wiring, venting, or plumbing to meet code



## Your worksheet

- 1 Write your scope's starting range from the table above.
- 2 List each item you want and a rough cost for each.
- 3 Add a 10–20% cushion for surprises behind the walls.
- 4 Make waterproofing a must-have, not a place to save.
- 5 Take this to each contractor and ask them to quote against it in writing.
